She is extending an invitation to the people of Maui and the Business/Commercial sector to come forward and make the permanent sanctuary a reality. We are presently on leasehold property, so having a permanent sanctuary is really а necessity. Can you imagine what we would have to do when we must move with several hundred cats? Our anonymous donor is hoping the Ohana of Maui will match or surpass her donation. However, every donation is a step towards our goal and is gratefully appreciated and a blessing. 9th Life Hawaii is supported solely through your donations and our kitties depend upon and need your ongoing support. As this holiday time approaches, please help those who cannot speak for themselves. If Maui is "No Ka Oi", let's make it No Ka Oi for cats too!

It is estimated there may be more than 100,000 homeless cats on Maui. 9th Life Hawaii seeks to compassionately and non-lethally control the cat population. We ask for your help to humanely control cat overpopulation by utilizing TNR (trap, neuter, release). Cats are trapped, and neutered and when possible, the cats are returned to their colonies. Volunteer caretakers continue to monitor the colonies and provide regular supplies of food, water and medication. However, some of our rescues are disabled cats, kittens and cats from colonies that have been under attack by humans or dogs. Other kitties have been dumped in the cane fields that are routinely set on fire as part of the harvesting process. Therefore, they can never be returned to the cane fields after they are neutered. All of these kitties will remain at our sanctuary until a loving home is found. 9th Life Hawaii is the only NO-KILL, non-profit, cat rescue on Maui that maintains a sanctuary for those kitties that have no other place to safely stay.

We still need lumber, roofing materials, chain link and hog wire to repair and expand the existing catteries, and a cat-loving carpenter/roofer/chain link installer to donate time.
