Every day, you see homeless, feral, abandoned and abused cats on Maui. They are in parks, on the streets and, sometimes, in your own yard. They are starving, sick and often pregnant. They have nowhere to go. They desperately need you.

Euthanizing (killing) cats does not control the homeless cat population. It is not the answer. The only proven method to reduce that population is to trap/neuter/release (TNR). By sterilizing the cats, you stop the problem at its source and this is the only method we advocate to control the cat population.

9th Life Hawaii has been doing just that for years. In addition, we are a sanctuary, a place where many of these cats can receive food, shelter and medical treatment. They are cared for, neutered and housed. We must end the uncontrolled breeding and educate people about the consequences of abandoning or dumping pets and abusing animals...

ANY animal.



Through the generosity of an anonymous donor, 9th Life Hawaii just purchased a wonderful property for our permanent sanctuary. But these cats still need *your* help. They need catteries built for shelter. They need food and medical treatment. They need to be neutered. Most of all, many of them need homes. Some of the cats are pets that were either abandoned or dumped by thoughtless owners or that ran away and now have no home to return to. They need *you*.

There are so many heart-wrenching stories...the kitten rescued from the parking lot of a major business here on Maui where it and its family were being used for target practice by one of the employees...the kitten who was tied by the hind legs and throat, whirled around in the air and flung against a car...kittens and cats used to bait and train fighting dogs...one-eyed cats nearly dying from infection after a run-in with bougainvillea...desperately ill cats...cats burned or killed during cane fires... cats and kittens starving to death...cats and kittens killed simply because no one would take them...

The average life span of an abandoned or homeless cat is less than 3 years. Our no-kill sanctuary provides protection, shelter, care and a chance for a life free from danger and abuse while waiting for their new parents to find them. We cannot do it alone. We need your donations to continue to develop this no-kill sanctuary, to help build catteries, to trap and neuter at-risk feral cats, to be able to continue to provide free spayneuter services, to take in abandoned or lost pets, to find homes for as many as possible.
