#### A NEW YEAR BEGINS & CHANGE IS IN THE WIND

Despite the challenges of a difficult economy in the past year, our supporters stood by 9<sup>th</sup> Life Hawaii and enabled us to help the kitties. Your donations allowed us to sterilize over 1,250 cats, adopt out 99 and rescue over 125 infant, bottle-babies. None of this would have been possible without your help and we are so very grateful

## WE HOPE TO DO MORE, MUCH MORE in 2010

We have already scheduled high volume Spay/Neuter clinics from January through April. We hope to sterilize at least 1,200 cats in these four months alone and our plan is to have monthly clinics thereafter.

We are also partnering with Maui Community College Construction Academy which provides practical, hands-on learning experience to high school students on projects that benefit the Maui community.

The students will be building these feeding station/shelters for 9<sup>th</sup> Life kitties similar to the photo on the right but our shelters will be larger.

You can help by donating lumber, paint, roofing, vinyl flooring and construction material and supplies. As these are built and delivered, we will be taking down the canvas carports we had been using for shelters as the frequent Maui winds have ripped most of them to shreds.

How many people in the United States would consider adopting from a shelter? 17 million


Are (municipal) shelters doing all they can to influence people to adopt from them? NO
